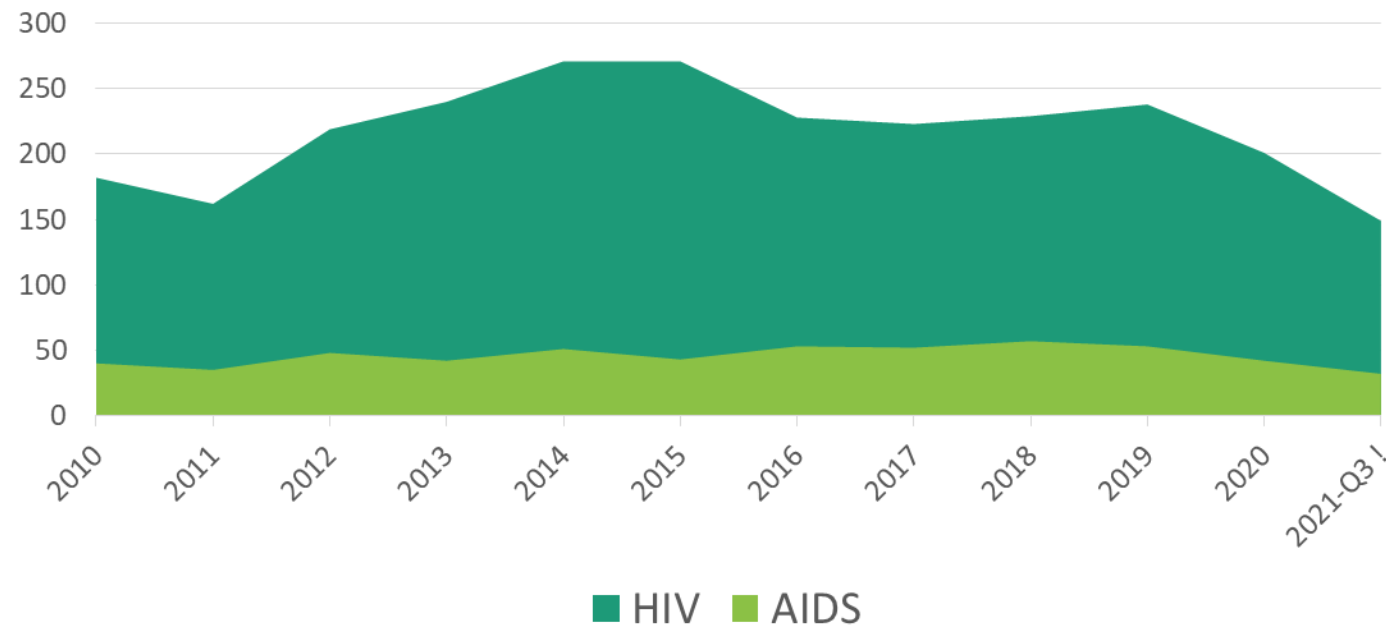
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Epidemiology of HIV/AIDS between 2010 and 2021-Q3 in Hungary



Hungary „cascade of care”

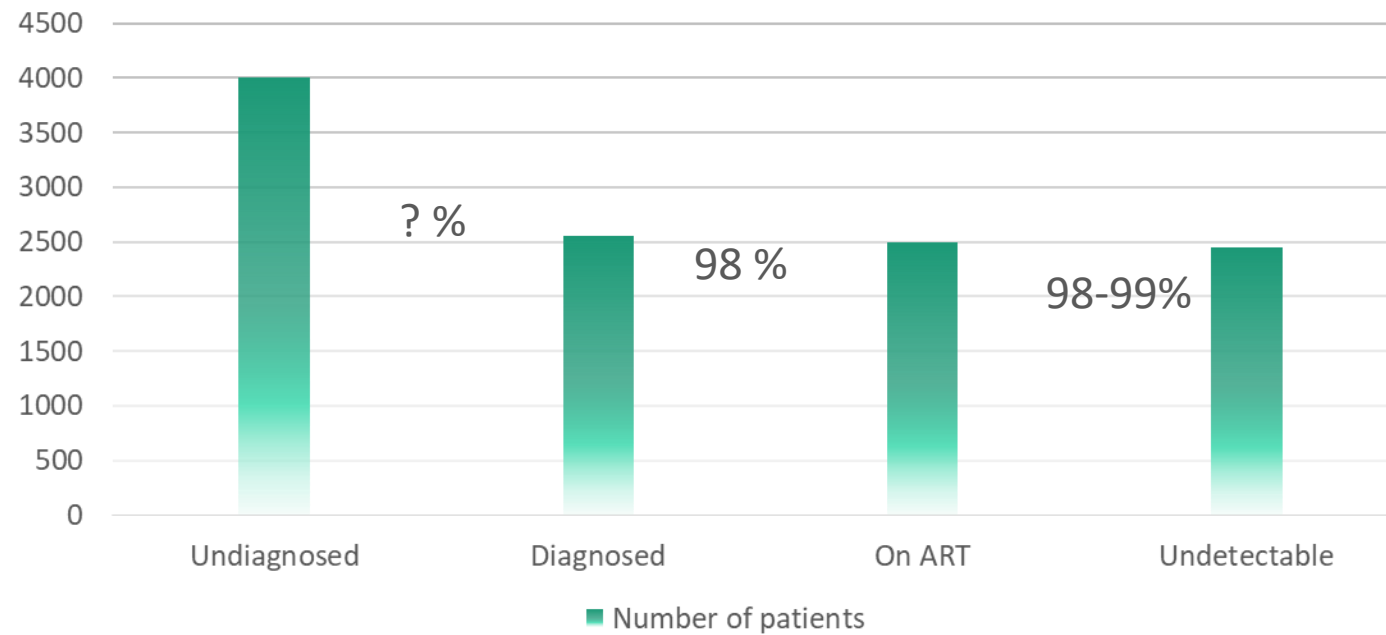
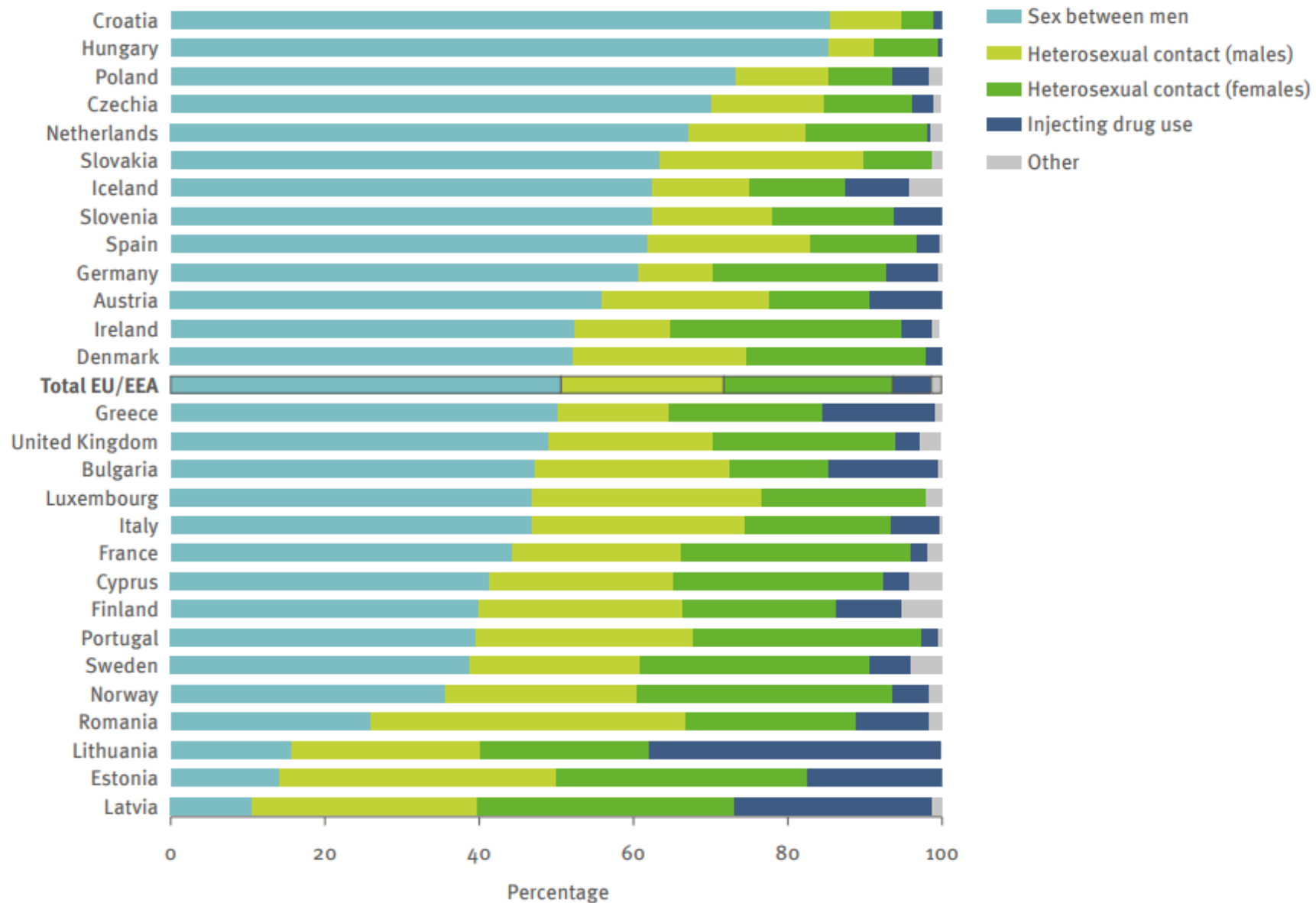


Fig. 1.5. Percentage of new HIV diagnoses with known mode of transmission, by transmission route and country, EU/EEA, 2019 (n = 18 957)



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clinical activities

Outpatient department

50-65 patients per day

Assessment of HIV patients at initial and subsequent visits

Prevention and management of co-infections and other comorbidities

Initiate ARV treatment, switching, simplification (STR)

regular follow up with blood test – 3 monthly

4 medical doctors (ID specialist), 3 staff nurses including clinical trial nurse

Inpatient department

Provide ward background for admissions related to HIV in the whole country

13 beds

Management of cases with opportunistic infections, malignancies, other indicator diseases or comorbidities requiring hospitalization

Managing ARV side-effects, toxicities

Managing STD and hepatitis co-infections

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other tasks and duties

teaching, research and management

- Prepare national guideline
- Taking part in international clinical trials
- Providing data for eurosurveillance reports
- Scientific research activity
- Teaching activity for graduates (medical students (hungarian, english and german program))
